PROJECT OPPORTUNITIES

Flu Treatment Education and Sampling Program

In the early Fall, NAWHC members will soon have a new opportunity to participate, at no cost, in an education and sampling program centered on XOFLUZA (baloxavir marboxil) treatment for influenza. In addition to a webinar for employers and their clinic staff on background and trends around influenza, as part of this program, there will be a XOFLUZA product overview that will include additional information on the drug's indication, dosing and administration, efficacy and safety. If you've not already signed up for their sampling program, you will also be given directions to access free one-dose treatment samples of XOFLUZA for a limited number of patients to test its efficacy in your worksite health and wellness centers.

Participating members' health care providers will also receive XOFLUZA coupons for future purchases by eligible patients, where XOFLUZA treatment is appropriate. This is not an endorsement of XOFLUZA or its manufacturer, Genentech. More information will be posted on the NAWHC website and firms can register for the sampling program at the Sept. 19-20th NAWHC Annual Forum in Dallas, Texas.

Behavioral Health at the Worksite Clinic Project

NAWHC will join Loyola University in Chicago, IL in a grant proposal focusing on improving behavioral health services at the worksite. The project will include: 1) Education related to integrating cutting edge behavioral health interventions into workplace health clinics; 2) A survey of employers and workplace health clinics related to behavioral health (creates baseline, trends, next steps); and 3) Translational Behavioral Health Research that provides employers with early real world insights and business solutions: what is working, what is not?

Employer Collaboratives on Worksite Clinics Project

NAWHC is partnering with a researcher to submit a grant proposal to PCORI (the Patient Centered Outcome Research Institute, created under the ACA) to expand employers' knowledge of the value of worksite clinics. The grant would focus on developing and applying lessons around employee health and performance improvement via onsite clinic/near site clinic learning collaboratives.
