2022 Large Employers' Health Care Strategy and Plan Design

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


<u>The Business Group on Health</u> annually surveys its large employer (5000+) members to identify key strategies and plan design trends for the upcoming year. Here are 5 key findings and areas of focus for employers:

- Virtual health received a boost from the pandemic, but there is still a role for on-site clinics both to manage COVID-19 testing and vaccinations and to help employees manage chronic conditions.
- COVID-19's potential long-term impact on employers will result in an increase in medical services, latestage cancer diagnoses, greater numbers of people with long-term mental health and substance use issues and other adverse effects
- Employers will focus on social determinants of health as a gateway to increasing health equity initiating programs and benefits to improve the circumstances that employees and their families are
 born into and live.
- There will be an expansion of access to mental health care
- While the health care trend was 0% in 2020, costs are expected to rebound in 2021 and 2022

The Impact of COVID-19 on Employee Mental Health

To help employers better understand and support the mental health needs of their employees, the <u>Integrated Benefits Institute</u> conducted an analysis of the impact of work disruptions of COVID-19. The study found that two in five employed adults reported symptoms of anxiety or depression disorder – a four-fold increase from pre-pandemic levels – and those in the south and west had the highest percentage of mental health issues Obtain a copy of the report here.

Marathon Health Expands to New Cities

Marathon Health announced an expansion of its Network health centers into seven new markets: Atlanta; Salt Lake City; Kansas City; Phoenix; St. Louis; Raleigh-Durham, N.C.; and Dayton, OH. The new markets will join Indianapolis; Columbus, OH; Charlotte, N.C.; Cincinnati; Las Vegas and Orlando to feature its Network solution which provides full-service primary care, including sick and preventive care, heath coaching, behavioral health services, chronic condition management and more, within 10 miles of where client employees live, work and shop.
